In the line of childes aside from canned goods Maine is by no means counted out as a producing center. The T. A. Huston Company, of Auburn and Portland, which erected a fine factory in this vicinity three years ago is rapidly forging to the front among the cracker and biscuit makers of the country. It manufactures over 100 different specialties in the cracker and cooky line, among which its Down East Cooky, a sweet cooky, cocoanut-flavored and iced in stripes, is easily a leader. A great variety of iced and marshmallow products are included in the Huston specialties. While Maine was originally the Huston territory, and its crackers are generally stocked in Maine stores, it has of recent years been pushing out into New England, and has already gained a strong hold in New Hampshire. Vermont, eastern Massachusetts and Connecticut.

The enterprise was started in Auburn in 1869, and has had a steady and healthful growth. All its baking is now done in its Portland factory, and the former factory in Auburn is used as a distributing center. About 200 employes are on the Portland factory payrolls.
