and those that are downloadable to a reader device.

Researchers will like our new 50,000 book Ebrary Academic Complete collection. Though the books don't download to other devices, the academic collection of books is fully readable online through URSUS or off-campus.

If you want to relax with something entertaining, check out our five new Kobo Readers which are available for checkout at the Circulation Desk with 100 titles already loaded and many more titles available from our *Maine InfoNet Download Library* on the library homepage [library.usm.maine.edu]. Popular titles include current best sellers, such as *Little Bee*, *Shadow Men*, *The Prestige*, and *Saving All My Lovin*.

The Kobo Reader is thin, light-weight and easy to use and holds hundreds of complete books.

Check one out today for 2 weeks. We think you'll like it!

I've had to create a works cited page or bibliography for <u>so</u> many classes and it never seems to get any easier. Citation style is such a pain and I never remember when to indent,

where to put the period, italicize, etc. Isn't there an easier way? *Help! In Portland*

Dear Help! In Portland,

Have you been living in a cave? There are several online "tools" out there that will create your citations for you and many databases (i.e. Academic Search Complete or OneSearch) will create the citation for you! *Son of Citation Machine* is probably the most popular and it's a free web site. *Duke University* has great examples for every style and type of source. *Zotero* is good and so is *Noodle Tools*. On the library homepage just click under *QuickLinks* and select *Tutorials & Citing Tools*. Click on the *Citing*, *Plagiarism*... tab and you will find links to all of these and more.

Oh, and I agree. Citation style is a pain with over 1,000 styles, but if you learn MLA and APA, you'll be fine. The librarians can really help with citation style, too. *Crabby*

OneSearch Debuts @ USM

OneSearch is our the new cross-searching tool that provides one search box for books, articles and more. No longer will you have to guess which catalog or database to use for every search you do. Quick, simple searches can all be done from one place. Look for it on the top page of the library web site.

And it's fast! OneSearch works like Google, by pre-harvesting all information beforehand in order to provide instant results. The user can then filter the search by date, etc. with similarly instant results. "Limit" your search to full-text, scholarly sources, time periods, and more.

Do you hate having to cite your sources? OneSearch will do it for you, so you just copy/paste the citation into your document. It will cite articles, books, DVDs...any type of material indexed in the system. Have fun with OneSearch!

Common Questions...

- Does the library subscribe to my favorite journal?
- How do I order a book from UM Presque Isle Library?
- How can I find a biography about so and so?
- Does the library have databases (access to current articles) about my topic?
- What is JSTOR?
- Does the library have audio books, e-books or movies to loan?

If you have similar questions, don't worry. We answer such questions all the time! We don't have everything, but we are almost always able to obtain those things we don't have.


