



Libby has performed at workshops, conferences and festivals throughout Alaska and in the "Lower 48" states. In the few weeks that If You See a Dream has been available, Libby has sold nearly twelve hundred cassettes and CD's.

Inspired by the dramatic contrast between Alaska's stunning wilderness and the high levels of violence against women, children and the land, Libby's music combines a sense of wildness and possibility with an awareness of the urgent need for humans to value all forms of life. A year living in India, as well as work at Yale University in American studies, also find expression in Libby's music — in its appreciation of cultural diversity, incisive critiques of American culture, and unrelenting call for social justice.



Libby is well-known and loved in Alaska as a singer/songwriter. Her strongly woman-identified lyrics, haunting melodies and warm vocals reflect a heartfelt response to a range of issues, from Native American struggles for sovereignty and dignity, to recovery from rape and incest, to the Alaskan oil spill, to the need for powerful women role models. Though her songs fall under the umbrella of "folk," they represent a wide-ranging diversity of styles, from country, to gospel, to Native American, to jazz.

Libby's first album, If You See a Dream, was produced and recorded at award-winning Triad Studios in Redmond Washington. It comains twelve original songs and is being released on Libby's label, Turtle Island Records. Libby does lead and harmony vocals and acoustic guitar and is joined on the album by a number of prominent Northwest musicians. The recording was produced by Dana and Dave Dysart and engineered by Dave Dysart.
