Casino Night & Bowl-A-Thon Successful
The Eastern Maine AIDS Network (EMAN) and the Down East AIDS
Network (DEAN) raised over \$5000 in two recent fund raising events.
On April 14, the Riverfront hosted Casino Night which featured Black
Jack, "Wheel of Fortune" "High Roller", and a horse race game, to name
just a few. According to John Silvernail of EMAN, "The people there
were clearly having a good time.". About 50 bowlers raised an
estimated &4000 at the Bowl-A-Thon on April 27.

According to Silvernail, EMAN will use it's share of the funds for rent and for direct client services, for which they receive no other support. Although pleased with the success of the fund raisers, Silvernail stated that he had been told by the owners of The Riverfront that the "regular Sunday crowd" did not show up for Casino Night. He expressed concern that the local gay community may not be informed about the true threat of AIDS in our area. "The profile of my clients is changing. The people I see now are people who became infected HERE, not people who have moved in from out of state."

EMAN's next fund raising event will be a Walk-A-Thon in the fall. We'll keep you posted. There will also be a Memorial Service on May 19. 1 panel from the AIDS quilt will be at the service. Watch the newspaper for the location.

Gone But Not Forgotten (Not By A Long Shot)

L.D. 430, An Act to Prevent Discrimination, has been defeated. Touted as the "Gay Rights Law", it was an easy mark for right wing zealots such as Jasper Wyman and his Christian Civic League. Mr. Wyman was able to convince many of his followers that the bill was part of a "Larger gay agenda that would destroy family values as we know them".

Lawmakers were divided on the measure as well. Some seemed poised to hide behind their contention that few, if any, lesbians or gay men suffer from discrimination due to their sexual orientation. At the public hearing on L.D. 430 on March 18, (the day after the horrible display of bigotry at the NYC St. Patricks Day Parade - thank you Mayor Dinkins), speaker after speaker told personal stories of how they lost jobs, lost promotions, lost custody of children, lost apartments... due to being gay (perhaps I should say due to our society's twisted perceptions of gay people).

Has this ever happened to you? A friend, partner, lover...? We need the protection legislation like L.D. 430 would have created. It isn't over. In all probability a similar bill will be introduced in 1993. What if we all started reporting when appropriate, or remembering or writing down instances/incidents when we are harassed, assaulted, fired, not hired... and kept this information use when another gay rights bill is introduced? There are many of our elected officials who need to hear from us because they do not think that the problems encountered due to one's sexual orientation warrant passage of a specific law.

Next month I hope to have the testimony from one of the leading opponents of L.D. 430. It will make interesting reading.
