GENERAL HONORS

Baccalaureate degrees are conferred with *distinction*, *high distinction*, or *highest distinction upon* students, except those with the Honors Program, who have achieved an average rank of B or better for their first three and one-half years' work. At the time of graduation three years of resident study must have been completed at the University of Maine, seven-eighths of the required hours having been acquired at the end of the fall semester of the senior year. The senior year, additionally, must have been in resident study at the University of Maine.

Baccalaureate degrees are conferred with *honors*, *high honors*, or *highest honors* upon students who have successfully completed the work of the Honors Program.

ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic costume originated in Europe about six hundred years ago. It consists of the gown, hood, and cap. Now much modified, each level of academic achievement still retains a distinctive gown and hood. The gowns worn today follow the American Council on Education's Academic Costume Code: gray bachelors' gowns for recipients of associate degrees and black for baccalaureate degree candidates, masters' gowns for master's degree candidates, and doctors' gowns for doctoral candidates and many of the faculty. University of Maine trustees wear a distinctive black doctoral gown with a shoulder yoke of Maine blue.

The hood worn for the bachelor's degree (now seldom seen) is three feet long, for the master's degree three and one-half feet, and for the doctor's degree four feet. Hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree. University of Maine hoods are lined in pale blue. This can be seen most readily in the hoods received by recipients of honorary degrees.

The edging of the hoods varies in width according to the degree. Its color is distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains. Some of these colors and associated subjects are:

Agriculture	Maize
Arts, Letters, Humanities	White
Commerce, Accountancy, Business	Drab
Education	Light Blue
Engineering	Orange
Forestry	Russet
Home Economics	Maroon
Law	Purple
Nursing	Apricot
Philosophy	Dark Blue
Science	Golden Yellow

The black mortar board caps are of the same material as the gown. The tassel may be black or, as is our custom, the color appropriate to the subject, except that the doctor's cap may have a gold tassel.

Most American colleges and universities use the gray and black gowns and black caps which conform to the above descriptions. Many European institutions have gowns, hoods, and caps of original and frequently colorful design.
