HUESTON BAKERY TO LOCATE HERE

Plans For New Building of Four Stories Are Being Drawn by Local Archi- tects—Site Not Made Pub- lic.

Several weeks ago it was said that the T. A. Hueston Bakery of Lewiston was looking for a favorable site on which to erect a big plant in this city.

It can now be stated definitely that the T. A. Hueston Company will locate in this City and will within a short time erect a "sun-light" bakery here.

The plans of the structure are now being drawn by Sawyer and Moulton of this City and they call for a structure four stories in height covering a ground space of about 20,000 square feet.

The building is to be constructed of concrete throughout and will have a frontage of 200 feet and a width of 100 feet.

A glance at the elevation sketches gives one the impression that the building is to be of glass, so great is the number and size of the windows. These windows are to be of the most modern type now being built and are of the so-called metal sash style.

The majority of the windows are 11 feet by 17 feet, having a light area of 187 feet each.

There will be rest rooms, restaurants and laundries for the lady employees. These are to be located on the top floor. There are also to be numerous laundries throughout the entire plant and also lockers in all sections of the structure for the help.

The administration departments and shipping rooms occupy the ground floor.

The baking oven is to be of the very latest type and is a wonder in size. This is to be 20 feet wide and 25 feet high and will weigh about 300 tons.

The location of the new plant cannot be announced as yet, but it is thought probable that the building will be erected on Kennebec street giving the plant convenience in shipping goods and receiving supplies. The Forest avenue base ball grounds was one site spoken of several weeks ago.
