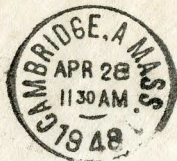


material expressions that I am not sentimental -


