January 22 marks the 10th year anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision which supported women in their right to a safe and legal abortion. In "celebration of choice," the Alliance to Preserve Reproductive Choice is sponsoring a number of activities the week of January 16, to include the following:

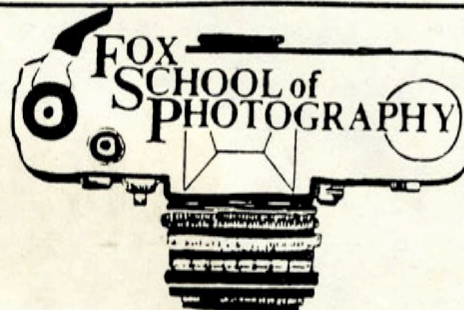
