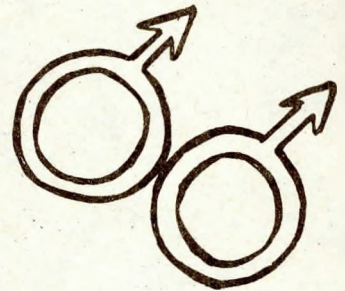
we shall study the author's points of reference and arguments, compare them with the principles of psychology and psychiatry, and judge them by success or failure.
