"THE UPSTAIRS" TRAGEDY CONTINUES

With 31 dead, two others beyond recognition, and 10 people still on the critical list, the recent fire-bombing of "THE UPSTAIRS", a popular gay bar in New Orleans, has proven to be the worst incident of sexist genocide ever perpetrated against our gay brothers and sisters since the Salem witch burnings.

Gay individuals and organizations, as well as an extremely large group of sympathetic straight people, immediately set up a series of blood-banks and collection funds to assist in the task of taking care of hospital and funeral costs, as well as suppling the immense amount of blood needed for the survivors.

Problems arising from this tragedy include the refusal on the part of some of the gay people's families to pay funeral expenses, inability of the victims to pay hospital costs, and the adjustment of a number of families of supposedly "straight" people killed in the fire.

Assisting in the work is the Rev. Troy Perry, along with the seven district members of the nation-wide Metropolitan Community Church. MCC New Orleans reports that the people of that city have rallied to help ease the strain of providing blood and funds.(cont.p.2)

For several weeks now, the female contingent at the Friday night dances at the Charles Street Meetinghouse has not been very impressive. In all honesty, there have been almost no representatives except for the few (5) regulars.

Gay Pride Week was a different story. Because the week emphasized unity, there was an unusually large number of women, and from the jubilation that permeated the room it seemed like all the folks were having a good time. What is difficult to understand is why we can't get together with our gay brothers the other 51 weeks in the year.

We are all oppressed in our gayness, and yet we continue to lead our separate lives. If we feel the existence of a sexist attitude among our gay brothers and do nothing to resolve the issue, how can we expect to grow as a constructive force in changing society? By eliminating the fact that gay men are real and not dealing with them, we have retained our narrow-minded heterosexual conditioning.

Remember New Orleans!

The senseless killings of gay and straight people at "The Upstairs" bar in New Orleans recently represents perhaps the greatest act of genocide perpetuated against us since the witch burnings in Salem. We must not let this incident get shuffled to the back of the newspaper. Everyone should be writing to their local paper, as well as Senators, Congresspeople and the police department demanding immediate justice, and insisting that this situation be dealt with.

Letting this slip by would not only be in ignorance of the people killed and injured, but would also convince other erratics who may be planning the same thing that it's easy to get away with. We must unite and defend ourselves against the senseless hostility of those who feel our existence a threat.

I, personally, am accountable for all of the above. An additional donation is expected of approximately \$500.00 from the GCC from the two special dances held during Gay Pride week.

Depending on what the cast of Coming Out votes concerning the status of their \$200 "loan", next year's Gay Pride Committee should have about \$750 to work with. This should enable the '74 Committee to plan an even bigger and better GPM than we had this year.

I think I should comment on a few questions that were brought up in last week's issue:

1. Charlie Shiveley's letter concerning "Sylvia Sydney."

The idea of "crowning" Sylvia as "Queen of the Parade" was originally my idea. I brought up my proposal at a Gay Pride Planning Meeting. Mr. Shiveley was present at that meeting and joined into the discussion. He asked the female members of the committee whether they would have any hostile feelings if a drag queen was queen of the parade. They decided they didn't. He then voted to make Sylvia Sydney our queen and immediately sent her out an invitation.

2. There were some complaints by members of the gay community about not having a second bus going to New York for the Christopher Street Parade. As of Friday, June 22, there were only 31 people signed up for bus tickets. Since that was the final date I could order a second bus, and considering I had no way of knowing whether we would even sell enough tickets to fill up one bus, I decided a second bus was not warranted.
