

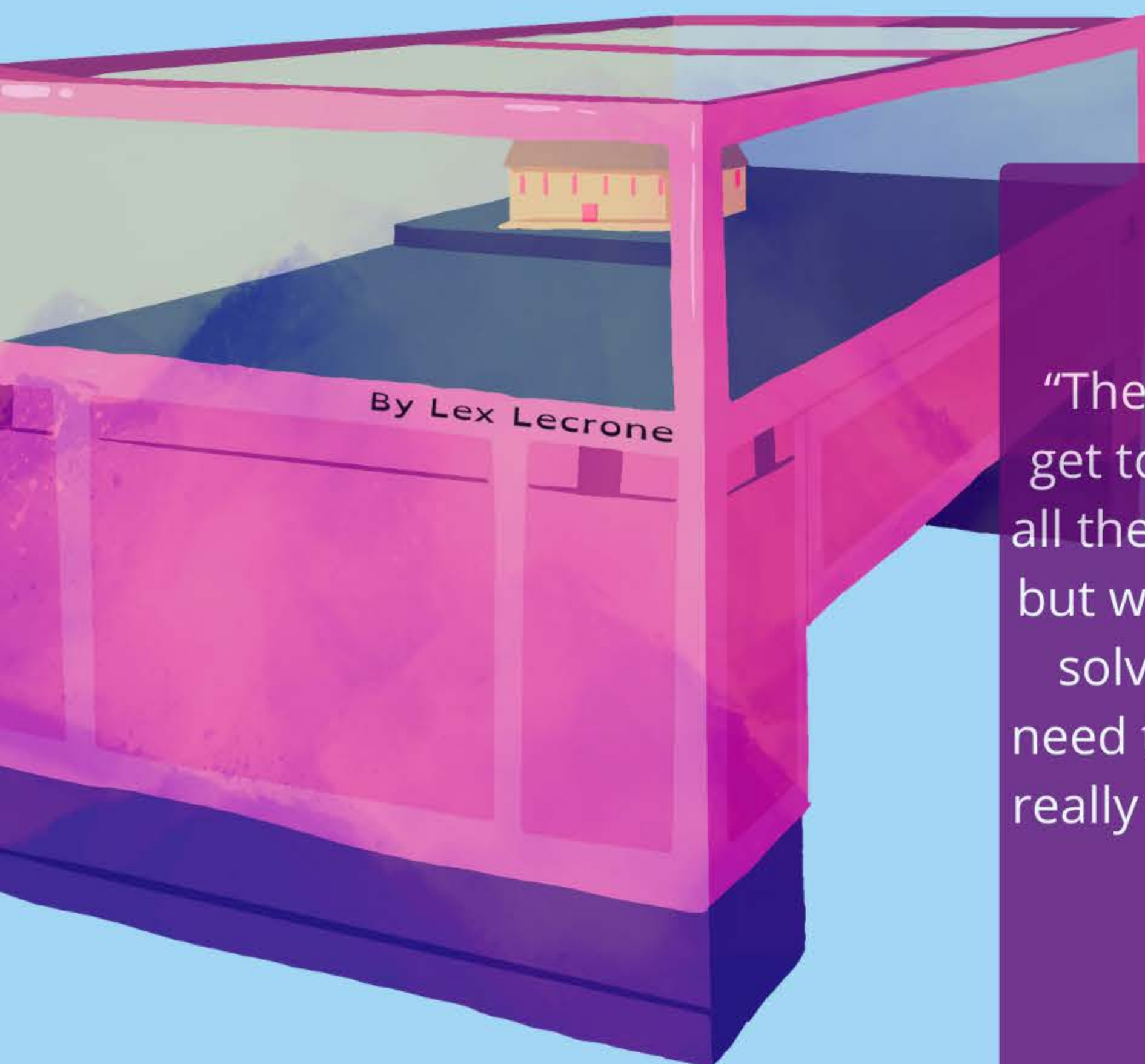
Why Do We Need Libraries?
