STATION: WCOU, LOCATION: Lewiston, Maine.

FREQUENCY: 1210 Kilocycles. POWER: 100 watts.

DATE OF PROGRAM: December 25, 1938.

TIME: 3:20 to 3:51 A.M. EST.

AUDIBILITY: R6, QUALITY: QSA3, FADING: SS. STATIC: X.

INTERFERENCE: Slight QRM from CHLT in Sherbrooke.

WEATHER: Clear. TEMPERATURE: 32°.

BAROMETRIC PRESSURE: 30.09 inches.

MAKE OF RECEIVER: Majestic, MODEL: 90 & 92. TUBES: 9, (AC)

ANTENNA: Antenna consists of 71 feet of copper wire reaching from roof-top to garage. It is 29 feet high. DIRECTION: N-S.

GROUND: Ground used is a lead pipe.

PROGRAM MATERIAL

Musical program originating from the St. Dominican Association Main Hall on Broadwood Street. The telephone number given by your announcer was Lewiston 1050. Announcer said that DX reports were welcome. The program was sponsored by the Vigilance Club.

The program is as follows: (1) Song by a woman with mixed chorus (Much clap ping), (2) Song by a woman with mixed chorus, (3) Saxophone solo, (4) Song by announcer in French, (5) Hillybilly Music, (6) Another hillybilly selection, (7) Song by a man in Fr. (8) Song by all accompanied by the Orchestra, in French.

When signing off your announcer said that this was the first program of its kind attempted in the U.S.A. He said WCOU would return to the air at 12:00 Noon. He gave his name as Guyler Duser. He also said WCOU operated 18 hours daily. Announcements in French and English.
