Albert Auger

Albert Auger, 80, of 44 Cook St., Auburn, died Tuesday afternoon at the Bolster Nursing Home in Auburn following a long illness.

Born in Auburn on June 11, 1886, he was the son of Alphonse and Marie Pelletier Auger. He was educated in local schools, and was graduated from Edward Little High School in 1908. He went on to study music first at Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, and later for five years in Boston. He was for 60 years the operator of a local music studio, where he taught piano, voice and organ. He was a member of St. Louis Church, where he was organist and choirmaster.

Survivors include three sisters, Albertine Auger of St. Hyacinthe, Que., Rev. Sister Marie de Bon Conseil of Mt. Merici Academy, Waterville and Rev. Sister St. Cecile of the Monastery of the Precious Blood, Levis, Que.; and one brother, Alphonse Auger of Auburn.
