**Van Dyck Room** (2nd view). — As the name indicates, all the pictures in this room (with the exception of two) are by this master. It also contains specimens of English furniture of the seventeenth century of exceptional beauty. This includes a pair of Cabinets made for Queen Henrietta Maria—two Silver Tables and Mirrors, one of which was presented to King Charles II and the other to William III by the City of London, and two Writing Tables, signed and dated Le Gaigneur, 1702.
