ASSISTANTSHIPS

The University offers a number of graduate assistantships. Assistants will be expected to aid the members of the faculty in laboratory or research or both. The remainder of their time must be devoted to graduate study.

Assistants are appointed for a period of one year. Reappointment is made on the basis of scholastic record. Assistantships may be terminated by the Dean for unsatisfactory work or for violation of the conditions of the award.

Assistants receive a stipend ranging from \$500 to \$900 a year and are obliged to pay all fees.
