However, we're going to try to get him to use the French column in the Penobscot Times, here in this land of French and Indians. I'm sure they speak neither Lewiston nor Aroostook French, but it was an Old Town woman who finally swung the pendulum to the decision to run the French column in the first place.

The new owner is due, Oct. 31. I believe his name is David Wollstadt, but that ma^y/not be the correct spelling. He was a college roommate of Ted^P Curtis, Jr., Orono lawyer and representative to the Legislature.

Attempts have been made to interest other publishers in the Elderberry concept but if any are seriously considering it they haven't let us know.

I'll be working on Penobscot Times right here at the same address so you can reach me here. I don't want to see the idea of a bi-lingual column disappear. It's too good to let it die.
