Manager reported that the State Chamber meeting will be held at the Eastland on Oct. 23. Voted that four from the Chamber attend. Tickets to be paid from Chamber funds.

Voted that the letter from the New England Division of the United State C. of C. be turned over to the Chamber of the State. The letter uggested that the local Chamber have a meeting to acquaint local business men of recently passed legislation.
