OLD BUSINESS

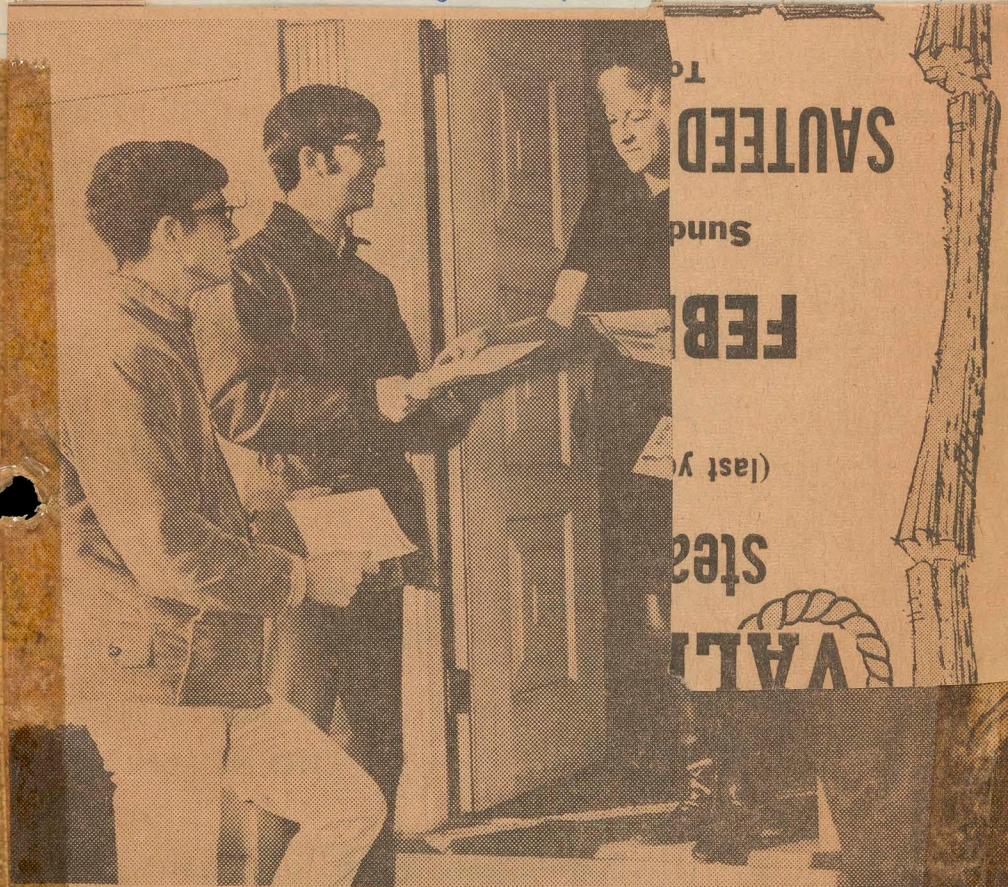
