Biographical Note

Eugene B. Jackson was born on June 26, 1923, in Portland Maine. He lived his childhood in Portland where he attended both elementary school and high school, graduating from Portland High School in 1941. During his schooling, Jackson was either the only or one of a handful of African American students in his class.

After high school, Jackson joined the Army Air Force in 1942, and was sent almost immediately to Tuskegee, Alabama with most of the other African American recruits. (At this time the US military was separating recruits by color.) There he trained to become a mechanical engineer, he was to maintain the fighter plane radios and communications equipment. It was here, Jackson said, that he started experiencing racism for the first time in his life.

Jackson served in the Army Air Force from 1942 through the end of WWII. After being discharged he had trouble finding work and decided to re-enlist from 1950-1951. Following his second enlistment, Jackson began working on an engineering graduate degree at Boston University. He would eventually become a respiratory equipment technician, and machinist.

While studying at Boston University he met his wife, Dr. Constance Cordice Jackson (1920-2006), an English PhD student at BU. The two would be married for over fifty years.

On March 29, 2007, Jackson and other Tuskegee Airmen received The Congressional Gold Medal. His hometown of Marshfield, Massachusetts celebrated him on November 10, 2012, a day that they would call "Eugene Jackson Day"

Eugene Jackson passed away on September 20, 2015.

Description of the Papers

This collection is comprised of family photographs, photo albums, bibles, hymnals, and newspaper from the early 20th century onward. The collection is organized into three series:

Series 1: Photographs

This series includes the personal photographs of Eugene Jackson's friends and family as far back as the early 1900s. The most common themes and activities found in these photographs are leisure activities such as trips to the beach or the mountains, family get-togethers, professional portraits, and Christmas greeting cards.

Subseries 1.1: Loose Photographs Loose photographs are organized into topical folders.

Subseries 1.2: Ruby Family Photograph Album

The photograph album includes black-and-white and color prints and negatives of the Ruby family at home and in travel destinations around Maine, New Hampshire, and Quebec, including the Brunswick area, Bailey Island, Portland, Sebago Lake, the White Mountains, and Montreal. The album was taken apart and divided into folders for preservation. Digital images of the intact album are available on USM Digital Commons.

Series 2: Family Papers

This series includes a birth certificate belonging to Pauline F. Jackson, as well as Gladys Ruby's birth certificate, and two copies of her death certificate. There are also several newsletters, notes, and thank you cards in this series.

Series 3: Books

This series includes books that belonged to Eugene Jackson and his family members. Except for a 1999 issue of the *Island Journal* featuring an article about Ashley Bryan, the books are Christian religious texts, including multiple bibles and books of commons prayer.
