Dear Madam,

I am sending you, as per your wish,
2 photographs, (the one on the organ console is
taken on the world's largest organ, 6 manuals
30125 pipes, blown by 6 large blowers totaling
209 Horse Power. Practically all the latest
improvements have been of my design, when
I was connected with Wanamaker in Phila.

Father Marchand has by now all press
material as well as the program, and I would
suggest you get in touch with him.

Incidentally an organ of my design, a large
one is now being built by the same organ
company which has built St Peter and Paul's organ
in Lewiston. It is to go for Marlinton
New Jersey Seminary (R.C.) for young priests.
and will be dedicated by Archbishop Walsh of
New Jersey this November. - I am to play the opening recital. -
My next recital after Lewiston will be
the dedicatory recital of a large organ in
the 1st M.E. Church in York, Penna. Oct 11th

I am giving you at random a few
news, which I haven't given Father Marchand.
If you want a very interesting article,
I would suggest you look up last year
"New Yorker" interview of June 26th (page 14
- 15. - It has a great deal of "everything".
