Upon my return here I checked immediately with the proper ecclesiastical authorities and learned that there is no authorized activity of the Catholic Apostolic Brothers of France in this country. That does not necessarily mean that the priest in question is a usurper, because he may be an Apostolic Brother, but his work here is certainly not authorized.

I read upon the train your very well written article about my conference. I read into every line your friendship and keen understanding of the message I was trying to tell. I thank you and I congratulate you on a very excellently written story, certainly the best story that has been written, in any language, about my conferences. I would like to send copies of Le Messager to French friends here, with that story and I would be grateful if you could mail me ten copies to my address: New Weston Hotel, Madison avenue at 50th street, New York City.

please give my best friendship to all my good friends of the Messenger, and also to the Mayor when you see him. It has been long since I enjoyed a day more than the day I spent in that very sympathetic French atmosphere of Lewiston.
