#### **Biographical / Historical**

Born in Wyman, Michigan, Francis L. Bailey completed his primary education at Central (Michigan) Normal School in 1915. He served in WWI, afterwards receiving his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Michigan. His career as an educator began with high schools in Michigan and,

following the award of his Ph.D. from Columbia University, he served as Commissioner of Education for the state of Vermont from 1931 to 1940.

### Maine Pedagogical Society Records, 1874-1884

#### **Biographical / Historical**

The Maine Pedagogical Society was a former branch of the Maine Educational Association. The Society first branched off of the Maine Educational Association in 1875 for the purpose of improving systems of teaching and education in Maine. In 1882, the organization absorbed the Maine Educational Association along with the Maine Teachers Association, creating a large network of education professionals.

#### **Scope and Contents**

Series 2 relates primarily to the functions of the Maine Pedagogical Society and consists of notes from annual meetings, correspondence between Society members, news clippings, and administrative materials. This includes a booklet created from pamphlets distributed during annual meetings of the Maine Educational Association from 1874 to 1881, and an 1878 publication describing the foundation of the State Normal School in Gorham, ME.
