Biographical Note

Robin Lambert was born in Houlton, Maine on July 28, 1950. He earned a degree in political science from UMaine-Orono and was president of the Maine College Republicans. Lambert was Vice President of Human Resources for Konica Quality Photo East, where he oversaw, wrote and administered employee personnel policies, until his retirement in 1996 due to illness. Lambert was an active Republican, serving on many campaigns, running for the Maine State Senate twice - unsuccessfully (1990 and 2002). He was a founding member of the Maine Lesbian Gay Political Association in 1983 and of the AIDS Project in Portland. He was also appointed to the state government's AIDS Advisory Committee in 1987.

Lambert was very active in the community, serving as President of the Maine Chamber and Business Alliance, and a member of the National Association of Manufacturers. He also co-owned Natasha's Restaurant in Portland from '97-'99. Lambert worked to address the complicated issues surrounding the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection as more cases presented in Maine. As an openly gay man with AIDS, with many friends at risk, he recognized the potential effects on all people in Maine.

Lambert worked to win equal rights for gay, lesbian and transgendered people. He died on October 27th, 2006 at the age of 56 after a long battle with AIDS.

Description of the Collection

Topics include LGBT issues of the 1980s and 1990s, represented through the media and through political activist groups. There are operational papers of the Maine Health

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Foundation as well as Lambert's personal meeting notes. Notes and letters from several other organizations that were working to educate people about AIDS in the 90's are included. From this collection you can get a sense of who Lambert was – many of his papers and letters are included as well as mementos from his life.

Series 1. State Senate Primary Campaign (1990-1991)

This series includes paperwork from Lambert's State Senate campaign in 1990: petitions, donor information, financial records, etc.

Series 2. Personal Papers (1983-1991)

This series contains personal correspondence as well as insurance information and other papers.

Series 3. Maine Health Foundation Papers (1986-2004)

This series includes materials from the Maine Health Foundation – operational papers, minutes, agendas, and letters to the board, fundraising events, advertising, and grant proposals. There is also correspondence with supporting organizations including the AIDS Project.

Series 4. AIDS Advisory Committee (1988-1991)

This series contains meeting notes and by-laws of the statewide AIDS Advisory Committee. Lambert was one of the members appointed; this series contains his personal notes and ideas. It also contains educational attempts made to raise awareness of AIDS prevention.

Series 5. LGBT Awareness Publications (1985-2005)

This series contains information on the AIDS memorial quilt and the March on Washington of 1987. Also included are publications from the Outright Foundation, the Speakout Project National Coming Out Day, and others.

Series 6. Newspaper Clippings (1988-1999)

This series contains newspaper clippings from Robin Lambert's political career and election as well as clippings about people who are suffering from AIDS and other LGBT issues. There are also clippings about Linda Bean and Governor McKernan.

Series 7. Objects (1972-2004)

This series contains a variety of items from all aspects of Lambert's life – from his political career to his personal life.

Series 8. Oversize

This series contains materials too large or awkward to fit into regular boxes. Listed within their regular series, they are included here to give their physical location. Items include posters, buttons, and a flag.
