BIOGRAPHICAL AND HISTORICAL NOTE:

Georgette Beauparlant Bérubé (1927-2005) was a lifelong resident of Lewiston, ME, and served in the State Legislature for 26 years, the longest of any other Maine woman. The daughter of Leonard and Blanche (Tremblay) Beauparlant, Georgette attended St. Peter's School and Ave Maria Academy in Lewiston. She later attended the University of Maine at Augusta and the Maine School of Commerce, where she met her future husband, Gérard Bérubé. The two married in 1952 and had two children, Claude and Michele Bérubé.

After working at the family business, Beauparlant Furniture, Georgette won her first election to the State Legislature in 1970, despite considerable backlash from Party elite, including "Mr Democrat" himself, Louis Jalbert. As a State Representative and Senator, Georgette was an independently minded democrat who often voted with Republicans on fiscal issues. In 1977 she controversially endorsed Republican candidate William Cohen for United States Senate and was later censured by the local Democratic party. In 1982 Georgette Bérubé became the first woman to run for Governor in the state of Maine. However, her bid was unsuccessful and she lost in the primary to incumbent candidate Joseph Brennan. She retired from the State Senate in 2000.

Georgette was a strong advocate for Franco-American heritage as a legislator and community member. She hosted a long running French radio station *Le Rendez-Vous de la Chanson* on the Bates College Radio Station. She was also a member of the International Association of French-Speaking Parliamentarians, the *Fédération Feminine, L'Union Saint-Jean Baptiste d'Amérique,* and the Financial Council of the Catholic Diocese of Maine. Additionally, Georgette was one of the founding members of the original *Centre d'Héritage Franco-Américain,* which became the Franco-American Collection at USM LAC. She was the chair of the Collection at the time of her death in 2005.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE: The Georgette Berube Collection houses the personal and family papers of Georgette Berube, a Franco-American legislator from Lewiston, Maine. The collection, which dates from the 1910's to 2011 consists of newspaper clippings, photographs, correspondence like memos and constituent letters, speeches, newsletters, certificates, and ephemera documenting Georgette's extensive political career and family life.

Series 1, The Georgette Bérubé Series, dates from 1970 to 2005, and forms the bulk of the collection and contains newspaper clippings, photographs, hand-written and typed speeches, as well as correspondence, letters, cards, and memo's from colleagues, prominent political figures, constituents, and organizations including USM, the Portland Diocese, St. Mary's Hospital, and *Fédération Feminine*. Files and items are arranged chronologically by date whenever possible. The correspondence highlights major moments in Bérubé's career, including her Gubernatorial campaign in 1981-1982, and her controversial endorsement of William Cohen for Senate in 1977. The collection also includes the manuscript of Georgette's 2004 book titled "Thank You Georgette," as well as campaign ephemera, newsletters, and articles collected throughout her career.

The Family and Personal Papers Series, which dates from the early 1900s to 2011, includes the personal papers of Georgette, her husband Gerard, and her son Claude. The series includes early school records, marriage certificates, baptism certificates, birth certificates, and military records. The series also includes condolence letters and other documents relating to the death of Gerard in 1977, as well as the tributes and eulogies from Georgette's passing in 2005. Folders are organized by individual and event, and items are arranged chronologically by date whenever possible.

ARRANGEMENT NOTE: The collection is arranged into two series: "Georgette Berube, 1970-2005," and "Family and Personal Papers, 1910s-2011." Files and items are arranged chronologically by date whenever possible.

The original collection was donated in 2010 and processed in 2013 by James Myall. This collection did not have an accession number when it was originally processed. It was given the accession number 2019.F1c.150.1 in 2019. A significant accrual to the collection was donated by Claude Bérubé in 2021 and has the accession number 2021.03. The two collections have been combined and interfiled as 2021.03. However, folders and items in box 2 are from 2019.F1c.150.1. Some items from 2019.F1c.150.1 were interfiled into folder 10.
