FROM THE RABBI



As we attempt to move on from the tragic events of this past November—Pittsburgh, Thousand Oaks, deadly wildfires—I would like to share excerpts from a new Thanksgiving poem composed by Americans of all backgrounds and ages— including many schoolchildren—responding to a request from NPR asking Americans what they are most thankful for this year.

The sun rising behind farm houses in the Midwest. The clear mountain rivers in Montana. I hope we have the wisdom to treasure all of it. A glimmer of dawn. First flickers in Maine. For the mountains, magnificent weathered beacons of topographical wonder.

Tengo gracias that I can speak my mind, y no aye consecuencia graves when I do so. I won't lie, I struggled with this question. With all the fighting, hate and violence, it has been difficult to remember to be thankful. However, when I read stories of people who stand up and speak out for justice and truth, I become immensely grateful and proud of America. Freedom to whisper against kings.

I am thankful that other people are still trying to come here. I am thankful for the vastness of our borders and the beauty of our natural lands. Sunshine streaming softly while we sip our morning coffee. But across the oceans our troops fight ensuring that we keep our rights, to give us a land of the free. For the first responders. For hope.

I am thankful for America's history, warts and all. Our past, full of light and dark. Read the history of heroes and villains. See our country for what it is. Free Press and free speech to speak out against injustices in our country. For family. For places to walk safely, places to paddle, arcades of trees, varied, inexpensive food, tools and workplaces...To worship whoever we want, to say whatever we want, to go wherever we want. For the public libraries. They raise up voices whom others attempt to silence. For diversity. For differences. My son is transgender, and I am grateful for those who treat HER with respect and kindness.

I am thankful that my hybrid existence, hinted by my brown skin and slanted eyes, can make sense in America. For many spectacular parks in our nation—from the huge and awe-inspiring Grand Canyon to the tiny neighborhood park with the small playground and the pretty benches painted by local artists. I am grateful that America can change, too. For the millions who take to the streets, challenge authority, insist on change, demand justice, resist evil, tell their stories.

A well-known Jewish-American joke holds that every Jewish holiday can be described like this: We were persecuted, we fought, we won, let's eat. However, there are other sacred days on the Jewish calendar that can be described differently: We were persecuted, we fought, we lost, let's fast. November saw so much tragedy and horror but also so much beauty in coming together, in caring, in shared tears as well as shared hope. Our traditional calendar teaches us that in fully confronting and fully experiencing both the tragic and the joyous—Yom Ha'atzmaut (Israel Independence Day) and Yom Hashoah (Holocaust Memorial Day)—we are most fully Jewish—and most fully American.

It was a small group on November 12th, including Bertha Bodenheimer, Judy Abromson, Lindsey Walker, Helene Perry and me, Lesli Weiner. We had read the first book in Maggie Anton's trilogy *Rashi's Daughters: Joheved*. Those who didn't come had said they just thought they wouldn't like the book or they had trouble getting into it and so gave up. Well, the five of us would

like you to know that you missed out on some interesting reading, making this a good addition to our 'erotic book club!' Anton masterfully got us engrossed in a love story while teaching us Talmud! This is also the story of the 11th century French Jewish community, how they lived, loved, worked, ate, prayed and interacted with their non-Jewish neighbors. And to quote the author, "I wrote this book because I wanted to share my research into Jewish women's lives in medieval France, how the prosperity and tolerance they enjoyed differed from the negative stereotypes usually associated with the Middle Ages."

Our next book has been changed to *And After the Fire* by Lauren Belfer. This is a National Jewish Book Award winner. What follows is a quick summary, so as not to give too much of the story away:

"The *New York Times*-bestselling author of *A Fierce Radiance* and *City of Light* returns with a new powerful and passionate novel—inspired by historical events—about two women, one European and one American, and the mysterious choral masterpiece by Johann Sebastian Bach that changes both their lives. Interweaving the stories of Susanna and Sara, and their families, *And After the Fire* traverses over two hundred years of history, from the eighteenth century through the Holocaust and into today, seamlessly melding past and present, real and imagined. Lauren Belfer's deeply researched, evocative, and compelling narrative resonates with emotion and immediacy."
