You are being quoted frequently these days in Lewiston-Auburn for referring to Lewiston-Auburn as the "cultural desert of Maine", some months

because it revealed a lack of knowledge concerning our community, but we dan't that statement haunt you forever, can we?

As a comparatively new resident of Maine, you couldn't be expected to know about the cultural life of Lewiston and Auburn over a great number of years. Evidently you were basing your assertion on the reduced number of artistic events in these recent years—something which can be said of many other municipalities—but, nevertheless, the statement did hurt, and it has not been forgotten.

Referring to it every so often, residents get to reminiscing about our artistic endeavors of past years, such as the presentation of the operas complete with full orchestral accompaniment, namely: Paust, presented at least three times at different periods and with different casts; Romeo and Juliet, Il Trovatore, Rigoletto, La Traviata.

Operettas we given in Lewiston and Auburn were even more numerous.

Just to name a few, La Fille du Tambour-Major, presented at least twice;

Pinafore, presented in a French translation by the late J.B.Couture, long editor of the local French-language newspaper, Le Messager, and founder of the radio station, WCOU; The Chilmes of Normandy, La Mascotte, Fra Diavolo, La Fille de Madame Angot, Les Noces d'Olivette.

The presentation of gratorios was an annual event for several music successive years by local residents, also by the Bates College music department. Our church choirs were long noted for their outstanding artistry, and to attend Christmas eve services at some churches that provided orchestral accompaniment to supplement the organ music was like attending a concert.
