These meetings are held Friday evenings at 7 p.m., in the Thurrell Room of the Memorial Union. The "membership" is technically limited to students and other University people, but all are welcome; no one checks ID cards. This group, the Wilde-Stein Club, is moving quickly; Student Senate recognition is the first priority here. The next Senate meeting is October 9, and our application is on the agenda. Also, tentatively scheduled for the latter part of October, is a showing of the Universalist-Unitarian Sex Education filmstrip "The Invisible Minority", provided by the Student Affairs Office.
