Bath. Me. Nov. 27. 1921-

Foods of various kinds for the refreshment table were donated by the members.

Table was presided over by Mrs. A. Bloom, Mrs. S. Shaniban, Mrs. M. Small and Mrs. M. Kutz.

The food remaining after the whist party was auctioned off.

The party was a financial success having cleared \$21.60 -

The treasurer reported on supper at Shul opening and showed a small loss. Also gave total treasury report.

thanks for his bread donation and letter has been sent accordingly.

Mrs. N. Povick donated 5 pair hand crocheted lingerie clasps which were raffled off.

A new velvet mantel for the Torah was to be made, Mrs Small donating the velvet and Mrs Petlock the silk for lining and trimming.

It was voted to hold ceremony for hanging the new mantel in Synagogue next Sunday and to invite all Hebrews to be present.

One of the first social gatherings to be held in the new Synagogue took place Sunday evening Feb 19th under the auspices of the Hebrew Ladies Society.

The larger majority of the Hebrews of Bath were present and the affair was considered a veritable success both socially and financially.

The chief event of the evening was the hanging of the new mantle for the Torah and also new draperies for windows and presentation of clock for hall.

The new draperies for the windows were made and donated by the Y.W.H.C. Club of Bath and the further interest and raise money, the hanging of each curtain was sold to the following at £1.00 each. Mr. Chas Crick presided over the auctioneering.

The first curtain was bought and hung

by Morris S. Povich. Second by Morris
Petlock. Third, bought by Morris E. Povich
and hung by Nathan Povich. Fourth,
bought and hung by Morris Cohen.
Fifth, Samuel Povich. Sixth, Horatio
Mikelsky. Seventh, Jacob Petlock.
Eighth, bought by Samuel Levin hung by Melnick.

The winding and setting of the new
cabinet clock, donated by the Hebrew
Juniors was sold and brought \$1.75.
Mr L. Chamson gave \$1.00 Mrs S. Levin 50¢
and Jacob Petlock 25¢. Mrs N. Petlock wound
up and set the clock.

A very beautiful blue satin and
gold trimmed mantel for Torah was made
and donated to the Shul by Mrs. N. Petlock
and Mrs. M. Cohen. The honor of hanging
this mantel on the Torah cabinet was
purchased by Morris S. Povich for \$10.00
and hung by Mrs. Povich.

Chances were sold on a hand made cushion which brought \$4.80. This cushion was won by Mr. M. Cohen and given back for auction which brought \$2.00 and was bought by Mr. S. Greenblatt.

Other smaller articles were auctioned off which brought \$4.38.

Refreshments for sales were donated as follows - Cake Mrs. B. Kediman, Mrs. S. Shamban, Mrs. S. Levin.

Candy Mrs. S. Green, Mrs. N. Petlock, Mrs. N. Povich, Mrs. M. S. Povich.

Refreshment table was presided over by Mrs. S. Green and Mrs. S. Greenblatt and brought \$4.38.

Dues were collected by financial secretary amounting to \$3.23. Total of affair to add to treasury \$29.17.
