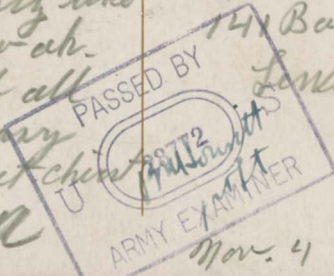


Waterloo Gallery (2nd view)—The site of this room was originally a courtyard, which was converted to its present purpose early in the nineteenth century. The walls are covered by portraits, all of which are of individuals connected with the final victory of the Allied Powers over Napoleon. A considerable portion are from the brush of Sir Thomas Lawrence. The Carpet, which is one of the largest ever manufactured in a single piece, was made for Queen Victoria in Agra Prison.
