**Legal Aspects of Municipal  
Parking Provisions**

MUNICIPALLY OWNED PARKING LOTS AND GARAGES—Charles S. Rhyne. *National Institute of Municipal Law Officers*, 730 Jackson Place, N.W., Washington 6, D. C. Report No. 121. 54 pp. \$3.00.

This report handles the subject from the viewpoint of the city attorney. It collects and analyzes all of the practical, economic, and legal problems incident to public ownership of parking lots and garages.

The report considers the various methods used by cities to acquire and to finance public parking facilities. The special section on municipally owned parking garages is of interest because of the review of the experiences of many cities with this type of parking structure. State legislation on the subject is summarized and discussed.

Another section is devoted to a consideration of all the legal decisions on this question. The attitude of the various courts can be clearly seen through a study of this section.

The appendix contains the full texts of the Pennsylvania, Kansas, and Iowa statutes and the Ann Arbor and Pittsburgh ordinances—excellent examples of legislative enactments.
