At both of these activities a light refreshment is served to enhance the fellowship and sociability of the hour. No one can remain stiff and formal very long while munching on delicious home made sandwiches, or eating someone's prize recipe cake or cookies, or drinking good coffee!

To give local women's organizations a chance to render a service through the USO to those who are serving their nation, we are extending an invitation to your Club, through you, to take the responsibility of serving the refreshments either on a Tuesday or Sunday activity hour. Sugar can be provided but sandwiches, cookies, cake, coffee, pickles, the usual menu, should be a contribution of your Club. This menu need not be adhered to.

Would your group be willing to be responsible for one night? This would mean bringing the refreshments, serving them, and cleaning up the kitchen afterwards--in other words be hostesses for the refreshment period. Members of the Servicemen's Wives Club will be on hand to show your ladies where the dishes are kept, the silverware located, tablecloths etc. Buffet style is our custom of serving.

Will you indicate on the enclosed card whether or not your group can do this. Also the person we should contact further. An early reply, as you can understand, will be appreciated.
