## From the Chair

Hello all

As we go into the busy, energizing holiday season, all my best wishes for safe and joyous celebrations for you, your colleagues and your families. I am so thankful for the extraordinary colleagues I have in our Educational Leadership, Kerry, Anita, Tom and Jody, not to mention educators in the field who take time to collaborate with us. In addition, I want to thank Jo Anne Sizemore for her leadership contributions to our Educational Leadership program. Jo Anne Sizemore, Assistant Superintendent of Scarborough Public Schools, has co-chaired our Educational Leadership Advisory Council, served on numerous focus group, ad hoc, and long-term committees to assist us, and found time to be a part-time instructor in our graduate programs. Like many of you, Jo Anne has championed USM through the tough times, and now is there to help us accomplish new, more challenging goals. I know that there are many, many "thank you's" to make, and in future open letters I will take the opportunity to acknowledge leaders of our learning community.

As we approach the end of our semester we are all busy meeting and advising students, reading and reviewing all types of excellent student work, eating lots of Holiday treats, and planning for the next steps to grow our graduate programs. What are the big wishes for the coming years?

Topping our wish list for 2017 is a healthy, vibrant program; it is our determination to add a full-time faculty member (just one for now) to join and work in our three programs. Our signature graduate degree is the Educational Leadership program which prepares assistant principals, principals, curriculum coordinators and superintendents. This is the program responsible for developing so many leaders in southern Maine, as many as 70% of the building leadership positions were held by graduate of our program in the past 10 years.

Our two other programs are the Professional Educator and the Ph.D. Program in Public Policy in Educational Leadership. Just to re-cap, the Professional Educator, a 30-credit graduate degree with the emphasis on teacher leadership. There are 12 -15 credit hours focused on high impact strategies for teaching, learning, assessment and leadership, in addition to a 12-credit concentration or certificate (e.g., literacy, ELL, mathematics, science, art) to be selected by the student. The Ph.D. program is now in its second cycle with 25 students immersed in their studies. It is a time- and resource-intensive program with all kinds of possibilities for creative problem-solving and innovative educational work. Finding this person will be a challenge, but the opportunity to build our programs is very exciting.

In order to support our request for a new position we are required to fill out all kinds of internal metrics and quotas, but most of all we need to hear from you. Therefore, we plan to conduct a survey of our alumni to evaluate our program effectiveness. We will be following up with a focus on the Leadership for Tomorrow's Schools cohorts, as well. Please look for our online survey message we will send out by the first week of January.

As you will read later the Educational Leadership program will graduate its 50<sup>th</sup> class this year! A save the date notice for the evening of May 12, 2017 is now official!! Read more in this newsletter.

Finally, as co-director of the Southern Maine Partnership, with Anita, I am very proud to mention one of our accomplishments this Fall. The format for our principals' meetings shifted to become on-site visits hosted by school principals. The visits begin with the identification of a problem or a goal, a walking tour followed by in-depth dialogue and more reflective dialogue on the identified problem. We have already visited four schools, and have a full schedule for the next five months. We are taking SMP to you! Anita and I hope to see you in one of the schools or at one of our other events in 2017 as we try to bring out valuable regional collaboration opportunities.

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## **Thinking About Internship?**

### I think I am ready for the Ed. Leadership Internship. What do I need to do?

The Internship and EDU 677: Seminar in School Management, should be the last set of courses you need to take before graduating from the Educational Leadership Master's. The Internship can also be taken to fulfill the capstone requirement in our post-master's (CAS) in Educational Leadership program.

Please notify Jody Capelluti at <u>joseph.capelluti@maine.edu</u> as soon as possible if you believe you are ready to start the Internship with the next group, which begins at the end of April. Faculty will review your transcripts and contact you to inform you of your eligibility.

### When does the Internship and EDU 677 Seminar in School Management take place?

EDU 685: Principals, EDU 686: Special Ed. Director, and EDU 688: Curriculum Coordinator Internships are nine graduate credits in total (three credits a semester) that span three consecutive semesters (summer, fall, and spring, respectively). The course meets once every two or three weeks for the whole year. During the summer, the meetings take place during the day, and during the fall and spring, the meetings occur from 7-9:30 PM. Individual meetings with you, your mentor, and your instructor are scheduled three times a year.
