AMERICAN RED CROSS

GIFT LIST

No gift should exceed \$1.50 in price. This standard should make all parcels equal. If more than one article is included to make up the gift, each article should be separately and attractively wrapped, and then they should be put in one parcel so that each man receives only one package.

Each gift package should have attached to it one of the Red Cross Council tags.

All gift packages should have a detachable list attached to the tag, giving the contents of the package and its classification -- Army, Navy, Togus A, Togus B.

TOGUS

These articles should have no service identification. In other words, they must be civilian.

These articles should have Army designation. In other words, khaki containers, etc.

These articles should have Navy designation. In other words, navy blue containers, etc.
