## **NEWSLETTER NEWS, NOTES & REMINDERS:**

(NEWS #1:) Postcards from Buster Episode to Air on MPBN. The Maine Public Broadcasting Network will air the "Sugartime" episode of the children's program Postcards from Buster on Saturday, April 16, 2005 at 10:30 a.m. The program generally airs on weekdays at 4 p.m. and on Saturdays at 8 a.m. Postcards from Buster is a series about a cartoon rabbit that travels across America and visits with children from different communities and cultures. The "Sugartime" episode was criticized by U.S. Secretary of Education Margaret Spellings for depicting two Vermont families headed by lesbian couples. "It is our belief that despite objections to the episode on national levels, 'Sugartime' should air in Maine," said Deborah Johnson, MPBN's Director for Marketing & Communications. "The overwhelming majority of the public who expressed opinions supported the broadcast of "Sugartime."

(NEWS #2:) EQUALITY MAINE writes: Together we made a difference in passing non-discrimination legislation for LGBT people in Maine. (ed. note: LD 1196). And together again, we can make a difference in upholding the non-discrimination law and in defeating a constitutional amendment on marriage.

The constitutional amendment on marriage (LD 1294) not only defines marriage as a man and a woman, but could nullify all domestic partnership benefits including health insurance, co-guardianships, inheritance, and disposition of remains. The amendment forbids any branch of government, state or local, from recognizing for purposes of benefits any relationship other than a married heterosexual couple. The public hearing for LD 1294 is scheduled for mid- to late-May and we need your testimony now! We are especially seeking testimony from couples who have experienced problems in areas such as those above, by being denied the right to marry. Do you want to host a potluck, attend a concert, or have someone to join you on that bus tour to Boston? Are you looking for someone to join you at the hockey or baseball games, for hiking, or to go to that special art exibit? Are you looking for canoeing, golfing, camping, or fishing partners? This is the best place to look. Think up something fun to do, organize it, and let us know about it....it's easy!

# CAN I ORGANIZE AN ACTIVITY THAT DOESN'T INCLUDE "EVERYONE"?

Yes. People who want to organize an activity for the GLBT and/or I community are free to set whatever requirements or restrictions they want to on the activity they're organizing. If you want to organize a "women only" camping trip, a "men only" drumming night, a "youth from age 18-24 only" dance, or a day trip to a water park for GLBTI "couples with children", that would be fine.

But of course! Not everyone who watches women's basketball is a lesbian! If you want to organize an activity around something that is "mostly-straight-but-GLBTI-friendly", then do it!

# CAVEATS:

All newsletters are emailed BCC, and the email list is not given out to anyone. Still, keep in mind that while this newsletter is for the GLBTI community, not everyone on the mailing list may be a "family" member. People ask to be put on the list and I put them on. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
