In each issue of The FAN the editor questions the readership about a particular GLBTI "issue", asks them to consider their beliefs and perceptions about that issue, and allows them to respond in an essay format. The responses can be of any length. In each subsequent issue of The FAN the responses to the previous question will be summarized (so folks will know what the general concensus is). I will also provide a link so that anyone who wants to can read all of the responses in their entirety (I will only give authors' initials for privacy reasons, but responses will otherwise be unedited is any way). Finally, the next question will be posed. This category of The FAN will continue only as long as readers respond to the questions. You will have two weeks to respond to each question. RESULTS OF QUESTION #1: The feeling among the respondents seems to be that "yes" we have a GLBTI community, but that it is splintered and has difficulty rallying around any particular concept (or goal) sufficiently to give it strength. QUESTION #2: Let us assume that a GLBTI community exists in Maine (as most of the respondents suggest), but is weaker than it should be because all the little sub-communities are more interested in themselves than in "the whole". Let us assume further that each of those little sub-communities is actually quite strong for its size because each is an intentional community of like-minded people (there's nothing like genuine "focus" to give strength). The question for this issue of The FAN is: What creative ways can you think of to harness the strengths of all those individual focuses in a way that will allow them to remain individual (people don't want to be forced to focus in a direction they're not interested in) and yet turn them into assets for the GLBTI community rather than liabilities?

Yes. People who want to organize an activity for the GLBT and/or I community are free to set whatever requirements or restrictions they want to on the activity they're organizing. If you want to organize a "women only" camping trip, a "men only" drumming night, a "youth from age 18-24 only" dance, or a day trip to a water park for GLBTI "couples with children", that would be fine.

## CAN I POST A SOCIAL ITEM THAT'S NOT GLBTI FOCUSED?

But of course! Not everyone who watches women's basketball is a lesbian! If you want to organize an activity around something that is "mostly-straight-but-GLBTI-friendly", then do it!
