4. The play *I Am My Own Wife* will be presented by the Portland Stage Company (in Portland) from FEB 28 - MAR 26. A profound and dynamic work that has become one of the most decorated plays in the American Theater, *I Am My Own Wife* was the winner of the 2004 Pulitzer Prize for Drama and The 2004 Tony Award for Best Play. Inspired by the true story of Charlotte Von Mahlsdorf, a transvestite who, despite all odds, survived the Nazis and later the Communist regime in East Berlin. How did Charlotte manage to live when so many simply vanished? Did she collaborate with the enemy? Was she a spy? Miraculously, Charlotte transcended the evil around her with a sense of goodwill, gentle grace and moral purpose intact. Playwright Doug Wright spent years researching and interviewing Charlotte and in the process learned about a history that was beyond facts and figures - the stories of lives hidden behind the Iron Curtain. A tour de force for a single actor as he takes on 35 roles to tell this compelling and human story that asks questions about love, loyalty and when the truth is too dangerous to tell. Following the performances on Wednesdays March 15th, and 22nd, there will be a post-show panel discussion with the performer, members of the local transgender community, and the audience.
