(NEWS #4:) Poll results.

1. The results of the poll asking if there should be a PRIDE parade and if YOU would participate in one were quite interesting. A full 75% of the respondents said either that there **should** be a parade or that it didn't matter to them if there was one or not. Only 25% said that there shouldn't be a parade. On the other hand 76% of the respondents said that if there was a parade, they **wouldn't** take part in it, or would only take part if they knew the parade met certain requirements. Only 24% said that they would actually take part. Results have been given to the Northern Maine Pride committee, and it will up to them to decide what to do with them.

2. The results of the poll asking if you knew of Jane Olivor and if you would go to The Grand in Ellsworth to hear her were a little more logical. Nearly 80% of the respondents said they had never heard of her; and nearly 88% said they would either NOT attend or would attend only if certain conditions were met (great publicity, a certain day of week, not too far to travel, etc.) Results have been given to the inquiring group.

2. Speak Up Speak Out survey is a project to gather information from LGBTQ/Q Maine residents age 18-29 (LGBTQ/Q is short hand for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgendered, Queer, and Questioning). What we learn will be written up with recommendations to state agencies as well as community-based health and social services agencies on how they can better serve our community. CAVEATS:

All newsletters are emailed BCC, and the email list is not given out to anyone. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
