1. Richard Steinman, our very good friend and long-time LGBT activist, passed away Sunday, September 17th, after a courageous battle with cancer. Richard was one of EqualityMaine's founders in 1984 and worked tirelessly for LGBT rights throughout the 80's, 90's and into the early 2000's. Richard was always there — lobbying at the State House, participating in events, rallying for our rights, and providing immeasurable resources. He was one of the most supportive and encouraging human beings I have ever known, and this community benefited greatly from his wisdom and his commitment to equality.

While in recent years Richard spent the winters in Pennsylvania, we loved when summers rolled around and he began to appear again at LGBT events in Maine. I last saw Richard at Barb Wood's (another founding member) 50th birthday party two years ago,

looking perfectly chipper at 78 years old. We will miss Richard dearly and send our condolences to his children and brother.

CAVEATS:

All newsletters are emailed BCC, and the email list is not given out to anyone. Still, keep in mind that while this newsletter is for the GLBTI community, not everyone on the mailing list may be a "family" member. People ask to be put on the list and I put them

on. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
