RE: "Socializing" vs "Being Social"

I have to respond as well to your letter about socializing. You did a very good job in pointing out the differences. I can contribute to this problem but with a little bit of a twist. You see, I am a heterosexual female. I know what any of you would say: "Stay with your own kind", "You don't belong here", "Why are you here?". You see the stereotypes that are set up just by me saying that I am straight? I know that the GLBTI community has been the victim of hate crimes and are considered "abnormal" in many circles. Of course, it is easy to blame ones self for the victimization. It's easy to blame others for it to. The fact is, no one has to blame anyone except the ignorance of those that perpetuate the myth. You see, I am white, privileged, hetero, privileged, but woman, not privileged. One out of three isn't bad?

The point is, I have been married three times. I have two children and three grandchildren. I know, that makes me an animal with three heads. But, I am old enough to not play the games with men and don't fit in any social situation. Not straight, gay or elder social circle. I am active in an organization and I have my cats. But no social life. The gay community sees me as suspicious, the straight community shuns me because I am not young and beautiful or easy to get in bed. So, where does that leave a fun loving, older woman who loves to dance, watch movies and basically has fun in life?

I have a button that I wear. It says "We're all in this together". I firmly believe that. Being ostracized isn't just a GLBTI characteristic, it is anywhere where the norm is having to fit into a certain mold. In the town that I was raised in, the norm was, 1. had to have money 2. had to be raised on the "right" side of town 3. had to have a family lineage that dated back over 50 years, to be considered the "right" social stature to be seen with. It still continues. To bad that we can't break down the barriers and just be people.

If you want to organize a "women only" camping trip, a "men only" drumming night, a "youth from age 18-24 only" dance, or a day trip to a water park for GLBTI "couples with children", that would be fine.

CAVEATS:

All newsletters are emailed BCC, and the email list is not given out to anyone. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
