1. Maine's Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA)

What if your partner was diagnosed with a life threatening illness? Could you be assured you'd get time off from work to attend hospital visits, be there during and after surgery, and care for your partner through recovery, or till death? Have you ever thought what you would do if you couldn't get time off? What if your choices were to not get time off, or take time off and lose your job?

It's not much of a choice, for sure, but one that you could be faced with in Maine. Fortunately for them, married employees are not faced with this choice. The Family Medical Leave Act allows married employees to take up to 10 weeks of unpaid leave to care for a seriously ill spouse without the threat of losing their job—enabling employees to care for loved ones in times of crisis while remaining in good standing at work. Would having the Family Medical Leave Act provide the same protections to same-sex couples make a difference to you, or someone you know? Are there other protections you aren't currently getting as an unmarried couple that affect your ability to care for your loved ones?

If so, we need your voice in Augusta. You don't need to have experienced a tragedy to share your concerns with legislators, the media, and the public. You only need to express how much this legislation would mean should the unexpected happen.

WHAT IS "FAMILY AFFAIRS" ?

There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
