1. Results of The FAN poll. By about 3 to 1 folks were clearly in favor of a new focus. So... the new demarcation line for the FAN's coverage area will be a line that goes from Camden, to Waterville, to Skowhegan, to Dover-Foxcroft, to Brownville Junction, to the Penobscot County Line, then straight up to include Aroostook County. Anything east of that demarcation line can now be included in regular FAN coverage; anything west of it can only be included if it's a "special" event or if it would logically fit into one of the other categories. I reserve the right to either reject or accept a posting from outside the area.

Some folks asked if I could at least include links to GLBTI events calendars or newsletters in southern Maine. I will try to do that as I become aware of them. Those links will be listed in the WEB BASED MAINE GLBT LISTSERVES & EMAIL LISTS category, so check it out to see what's available.

There were also a variety of suggestions about how to consolidate and reformat The FAN so it would be shorter and more concise. I will be making some changes over the next few issues. For one thing, the EVENTS category will now be divided into EVENTS (CHANGING) and then EVENTS (ONGOING). Ongoing events (those that have the same days/time/place every month) will be listed once instead of being listed every day on which they occur. You folks will need to figure out the actual days of the month they are being held, but I think you're all smart enough to do that.

A few items which have been appearing in the EVENTS category, and which are now outside the coverage area, will be moved to the SOCIAL GROUPS (MORE THAN 50 MILES FROM BANGOR) category.

Other changes will be made over the next few issues to try to shorten some entries and remove those that may be outside the coverage area.

And to the folks in Aroostook and Washington counties: We are now including you! This is your opportunity to have a way and a place to organize and advertise your local events. So get as many of your local GLBTI community members onto The FAN mailing list as possible and start using it to get your word out.

A simple curriculum for all ages that focuses on the many definitions of what a relationship is, how to maintain a healthy relationship and ways to protect yourself from unhealthy relationships. The class discusses personal triggers that we all have which "trigger us" to make unhealthy decisions.

Tent sites have been reserved for July 26-29 (3 nights) at South Branch Campgound in the northern end of the Park. From this campground, there are opportunities for easy/moderate hikes (Howe Brook Trail, South Branch Mountain, Pogy Notch Trail) as well as more strenuous hikes (North Traveler, Center Ridge, or the new Traveler Loop, a 10+ mile hike with awesome views —every bit as challenging as climbing Mt.
