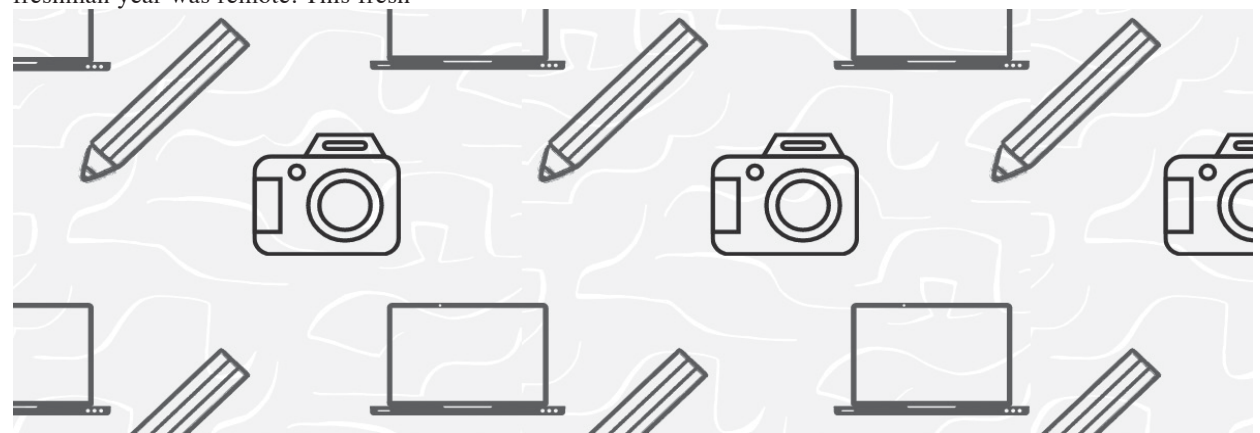

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Masking for in-person presence in Fall 2021

University of Maine System requiring vaccination

The University of Maine System shared via an important message from Chancellor Dannel Malloy on August 4 that requiring vaccination to participate in an on-campus experience in Fall 2021 is now UMS policy. As of August 18, masks are required indoors on UMS campuses again. Students must verify vaccination status, or be in the process of being vaccinated by August 20, or they will not be allowed on campus in the fall.

The message stated, “Students who verify their status or get their first shot toward full vaccination by Friday, August 20, will remain eligible to participate in on-campus

activities in the fall semester. Students also have an opportunity to request and receive an exemption to the vaccine requirement for a documented medical contraindication or a sincerely held religious belief. Discussions are underway with bargaining unit partners regarding a similar policy for UMS faculty and staff.”

Chancellor Malloy’s message on August 18, shared with students via email reads, “Effective today through September 30, 2021, face coverings are required indoors at University facilities for all persons — students, staff, faculty and visitors — regardless of vaccination status. Individuals working in an office by themselves with the door closed need not wear a face covering.”

The University of Maine System is utilizing a secure portal for students and staff to upload photographic proof of vaccine cards. To request a medical or strongly held religious belief, which does not allow for a vaccination, follow the instructions on this website.

USM President Glenn Cummings said, “Getting vaccinated not only protects you, it also protects others as well. The State Theater’s marquee reads ‘Vaccines are a gateway drug to concerts,’ I would say vaccines are a gateway to normalcy.”

As for additional support the university will provide to remote students, Cummings said, “USM was fortunate entering the pandemic that we have a well established ability to teach online. And over the past 18 months we’ve been able to provide our faculty with more training, our programs with more resources, and our students with more opportunities. We will continue to remove barriers and provide support where we can.”

Having worked 80-90% of the last year out of his office, Cummings looks forward to being able to connect with students and colleagues again.

“I believe this was the best course of action to keep our university and community safe given the recent rebound and rapid increase in cases,” said Cummings.

“I would tell anyone who is on the fence that getting fully vaccinated is the thing you can do to get back to experiencing normal life. I can’t think of a time when so little has been asked of us for so much good in return,” said Dean of Students, Rodney Mondor.

Someone is considered fully vaccinated two weeks after their final dose of a vaccine. In the case of Johnson & Johnson’s/Janssen, the single-dose vaccine, that is two weeks after their shot. Two-dose shots like Pfizer and Moderna require a second dose of the vaccine a month after the initial vaccination. Two weeks after the second dose, the person is considered fully vaccinated.

As of August 19, the entire UMS had administered a total of 177,265 asymptomatic COVID-19 tests. In the last fourteen days, 488 tests had been administered and only two were positive. 618 tests have been positive out of all that were administered.

Third-year business management major, Lexi Cook, said, “I’m excited to get back to in-person classes and to be more interactive with my classmates.”

Ian Dudley, a fifth-year communication

major with a concentration in media production, said he thinks it “would be a good indenture for students to get vaccinated, however might be unfair to those who may have reactions or no insurance, unless covered regardless. Honestly, I’m just excited to be back on campus around people just like me looking to find their way.”

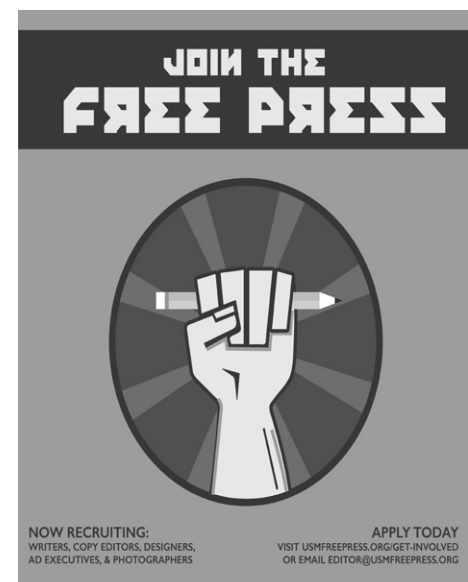

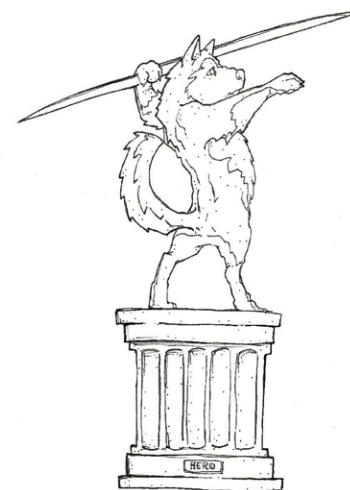

Welcome from USM Libraries

USM Libraries are OPEN to USM students, faculty and staff for in-person work and support. We also offer a variety of online services. Welcome!

To enter the library buildings you will need your USM ID card so you can “swipe in” at the front door. Please wear a face covering per current guidelines.

To use our online library services and resources, log into your MyUSM portal and navigate to the Libraries (under the Technology & Resources tab).

The Libraries offer a variety of in-house resources to help you achieve academic success. All of our buildings have student computers and areas where you can study alone or with peers. Check out books, borrow laptops, ask about reserve materials your faculty members have requested for your classes, and ask general questions about the libraries at our Access Services desks, which you will see as soon as you enter any of our spaces. Visit our Research Assistance desks and let our librarians

direct you to the perfect sources for your research needs. Learning Support (including peer-to-peer tutoring services) is also available at each of our libraries. Technology Assistance can be found on the 3rd floor of Glickman Library, staffed by UMS IT. Our libraries offer group study rooms, privately enclosed spaces that individuals or small groups can reserve for up to three hours.

We have refreshed some of our physical spaces this summer, with all three Libraries having the furniture reset to new configurations to support your study needs. Check out the Library Living Room on the 3rd floor of Glickman at the Forest Avenue/Bedford Street corner!

We have also reconfigured our peer support service spaces in all three Libraries. In Gorham, peer support services are now located on the 2nd floor. Writing services in the Glickman Library are now in a new space on the 3rd floor, directly adjacent to the computer lab. At our LAC location, two

of the individual office spaces (145D and 145E) located behind the main service desk will now be virtual service rooms; these private and comfortable spaces will afford students all the resources needed to access live online appointments with USM’s entire array of peer support services, including Subject-Based Tutoring, Writing Assistance, Peer Academic Coaching, Technology Assistance, and Adult Learner Coaching. Students from all three campuses can access all of the learning support programs and services via the new Learning Commons site in MyUSM. Other access points include the one-click scheduling option on the USM Brightspace landing page, and the “Academic Support Resources” link found in the Course Resources tab of every Brightspace course at USM.

Glickman Library also has new signage that indicates appropriate noise levels for each of our 7 floors. This is in response to student feedback about wanting to know

which floor is best for their academic needs. New signs indicate a floor/space as being Collaborative, Whisper, or Silent. For example, a Collaborative space allows for some noise, working in groups, conversation, and the energy is neighborly, cooperative, creative (examples 1st floor Gorham Library, 2nd floor Glickman Library), while in a Whisper space the noise is hushed, muted, and the energy is focused, productive, and calming (examples 2nd floor Gorham Library, 7th floor Glickman Library).

Assistance is readily available within the Libraries or through our Ask-A-Librarian service. We look forward to seeing you in the library this semester and supporting your academic goals!

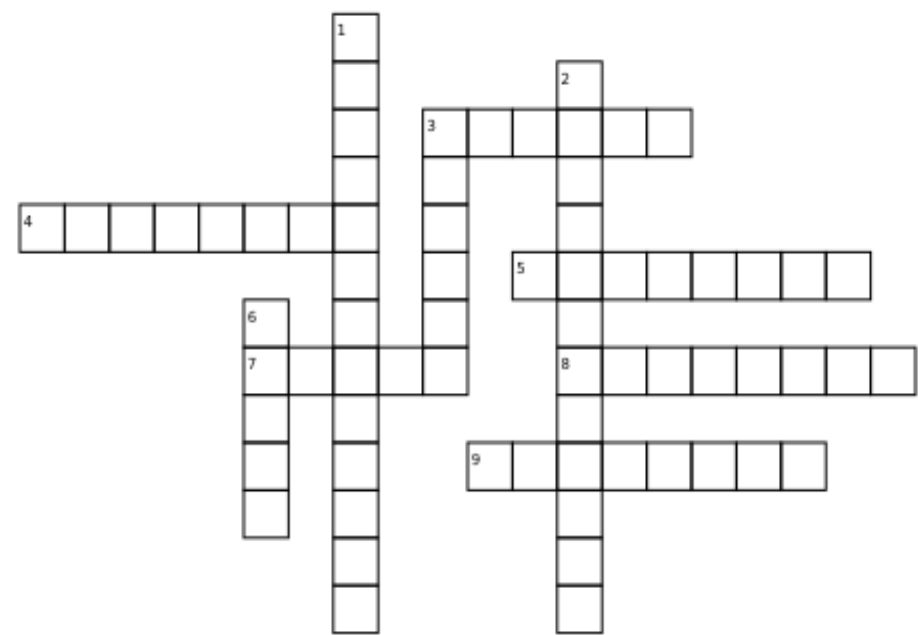
