1. Graduate student seeks to interview lesbian moms. I am a graduate student in Human Development at the University of Maine. I am interested in interviewing lesbian biological moms with children of any age living in Maine communities about their experiences: 1) to explore how living in a rural state helps or complicates the experiences of lesbian mothers in how they negotiate institutions such as health care and school, and 2) given social and political constraints that lesbian mothers need to overcome or adapt to, explore how mothers make use of support systems and form family. Almost all of the previous research has been conducted with moms living in urban or metropolitan areas. To maintain confidentiality, I'm trying to get the word out through intermediaries and having participants contact me directly if they are willing to be interviewed. The Maine areas we're presently covering in this category are: Aroostook County, Washington County, Ellsworth/MDI, Bangor, Belfast/Camden, Waterville/Skowhegan, and Dover-Foxcroft.

1. World AIDS Day 2007- A report from the greater Bangor community. (Thanks to Joe for this report.)

November 30th- On the front steps of the University of Maine a small group of students and administration gathered with candles lit to take turns speaking about what World AIDS Day meant for them and why they were there. That day 3 panels from the AIDS Quilt had been on display in the Student Union. An estimated 1000+ people stopped to look at the panels through the day.

December 1st- Despite the frigid temperatures, biting wind, and other community events going on, 50 Bangor area residents took time out of their schedule to attend the World AIDS Day events hosted by Eastern Maine AIDS Network. The events started at 6pm at the Hammond St Church. As people first filed in they were all in a hushed manner as they were immediately put in the presence of 4 of the AIDS Quilt panels. Along with the Quilt panels, there was also a time-line on display that listed by year all of the advances and set-backs in research, education, prevention, treatment, support, etc. A few words were said at 6:30 and then everyone was given a candle to hold as they formed a circle outside (in the freezing weather) to observe 200 luminaries all lit in the shape of a red ribbon. One tail of the "ribbon" was left unlit so that individuals could light a luminary for themselves or a loved one. When the cold became too much, the group returned indoors for a last cup of hot beverages and a cookie before going separate ways.

December 5th and 6th- At Foxcroft Academy in Dover-Foxcroft a small group of students and faculty gathered together in the library to view a panel from the AIDS Quilt. Also on display was the film "Lest We Forget" which showed clips from 1996 when the AIDS Quilt was displayed in its entirety on the national mall at Washington D.C. Red ribbons were given to all who attended.

Through the entire week before and after the actual World AIDS Day a large focus remained on the panels from the AIDS Quilt. There was a strong sentiment that even though most of these panels are from the early to mid 90's they still remain a very powerful tool for helping to bring home the message of what World AIDS Day is about. Each panel is 12 feet by 12 feet. They take several people to unfold and several more to hang them. Their size alone is impressive. And then you look at them. At Eastern Maine AIDS Network as each panel was unfolded it was awesome. On each panel includes 8 smaller portions; each telling a piece of a story about someone who had HIV/AIDS. If the names and the stories weren't enough, the detail and love that went into each piece is very moving. As the Quilt squares were taken around to the various locations where they were displayed each time there was a sense of reverence shared for each panel.

As we reflect on this past World AIDS Day and plan for the upcoming year, we hope that everyone will remember that although December 1st is designated as World AIDS Day, here at Eastern Maine AIDS Network, every day is World AIDS Day. It is important to keep up the prevention and education efforts year round. By preventing just one new person from HIV infection, not only does that have a profound impact on the life of that individual, but also relieves local, state and federal agencies from the lifetime economic burden of caring for that person's needs. By educating our community in prevention techniques today, we save millions of dollars, as well as lives.

It is also equally important to continue to champion those who are living with HIV/AIDS. Please, every day wear a red ribbon, speak out in support, and take a leadership role within your community.

2. The latest goings-on with the Gay Guys Group. (Thanks to Rick for this report.)

The GGG potluck was held at Mark's home in Brewer. We had about 30 guys in attendance. It being a potluck dinner, various dishes were presented including, but not limited to humus, cheese and crackers; a homemade pumpkin soup with sour cream and toasted pumpkin seeds; guacamole stuffed and traditional deviled eggs. Among the favorite desserts were a chocolate cake with cream cheese frosting; Behr's homemade blueberry tart; a very light cheesecake; fresh fruit and sugar cookies from Hanaford's. Accompanying the food was a wide array of soft drinks including festive eggnog, there was also wine available for those who chose to have some.

Most of the evening was spent catching up with old friends and making new ones. There was talk about life in THE County verses life in the big city of Bangor. We talked about how bananas are good for you.

A decision was made over the past month to give to a charity as a collective group of gay men. We collected \$165 at the potluck, for a total of \$600 (this does not include an additional amount donated by one gaymale couple who have taken on the job of buying gifts for one of the children which I am guessing they have spend at least \$75) has been collected over all, we have adopted a family of 5 at the homeless shelter in Ellsworth. After buying gifts for the family in Ellsworth the remainder of the money probably \$300 will be given to the homeless shelter in Bangor.

There was a discussion about forming a gay dance club. Preferably a guy's square dance or contra dance organization, but open to suggestions. Anyone interested can contact me at bangorwinelover@yahoo.com.

CAVEATS:

All newsletters are emailed BCC, and the email list is not given out to anyone. Still, keep in mind that while this newsletter is for the GLBTI community, not everyone on the mailing list may be a "family" member. People ask to be put on the list and I put them on. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
