Dear Daddy -

I have enjoyed a very restful Sunday - after the phone calls, I washed and ate a little breakfast. We then got athletic and threw a medicine ball around for a while. After a couple of quick games of horseshoe. Matthew and I cleaned up and went into Baltimore. We had a good meal and came on back. I called the SWB and was promised that if I got to Baltimore ~~YANKEE~~ by 5:00 PM I would be taken care of for tomorrow night's seeds. So I will have to get off tomorrow afternoon around 2 and head for town. I guess that everything will work out all right.

I am pretty well caught up in my mail as the weekend has not been a complete failure. I am enclosing the check for \$1.33 - as please acknowledge receipt of this letter. I will let you know when my summer uniforms reach me.

We have a congenial group in the barracks - Matthew, whom I met at See as you know; two young doctors fresh in the army - Fleischman from NYC and Edie from Norfolk; and several assorted Ordnance and Air Corps officers. All in all enduring these remaining few weeks need not be too unpleasant.

ready to go to the cottage.

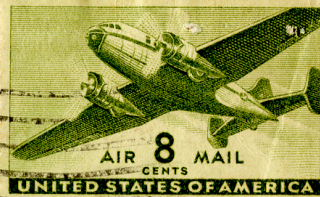
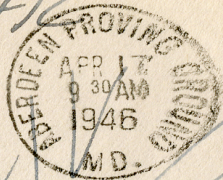
Things are quiet tonight - we may play our cards, I'm
