Friday Evening:

While it does not have flush toilets, it does have portable toilet facilities, picnic tables and hibachis, a volleyball court, a nice big lawn, a fair amount of parking, and the greatest view you've ever seen. After about a mile, turn right onto Sargent Drive, at between a half and three-quarters of a mile, look for the pride flag on the right. Enter to the right.

Things To Note:

There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
