Sue Davies writes: "It may be of interest to the FAN readers that the Charlie Howard Memorial is in place in Bangor, down the stairs by the State Street Bridge over the Kenduskeag where Charlie died in 1984. It is a simple, quiet, reflective place. The plantings will be done by the Bridge Alliance in the spring, and the dedication will be on July 7, 2009 as part of the five-day 'Charlie Howard Remembered' event that week. November's *Second Friday* performance will feature Acorn actors reading Gage's new scripts *Souvenirs from Eden* and *The A-Mazing Yamashita and the Gold-diggers of 2009*. Souvenirs from Eden revolves around the ghost of lesbian poet Renée Vivien, who returns to a pivotal memory from the summer of 1900, when she was in Bar Harbor ("Eden"), Maine, with her lover Natalie Barney. She wrestles with scenarios of traumatic memories in an attempt to find closure. *The A-Mazing Yamashita and the Gold-diggers of 2009* features a magician who promises to levitate a woman, cut a woman in two, and disappear a hundred thousand women - all through the wizardry of modern pharmaceuticals, the presto-chango of sexual commodification, and the wonders of the Great Cabinet of GATT. Both plays are currently being revised by Gage, whose previous work has been featured locally at two *Maine Short Play Festivals* and at other festivals around the world. Do Political Campaigns Really Matter?

In case you haven't figured it out yet, I'm really *not* a very politically minded person. I find that these big national elections (heck, even some of the smaller state-sized elections) with their negativity, backstabbing, mis-information, name calling, lack of substantial discussion of the issues, fear-mongering, prejudice, and downright lying on both sides leaves me feeling cold, disheartened, and even dirty from having contact with it all. I do not for a moment believe anyone on either side who tells me that "if only so-and-so can get elected, then he/she will lead the country in a better direction and all our woes will disappear."

My perception is that political reality is actually 180 degrees at odds with that way of thinking. As far as I can tell, there has never been a "politician" of any sort who has been able to lead the electorate in a direction that they were not already willing to go in. There is that saying: "When the followers lead, the leaders will follow." I do not think that political campaigns are a matter of convincing anyone of anything. Certainly no one is going to convince others of anything by abusing, insulting, and intimidating them.

Nor do I think that people decide who to vote for based on the intelligence or convincing power of the candidate. At best, only an insignificantly small number of people are convinced by any debate. Rather, people know what they believe and look for a candidate who most closely reflects those beliefs. The candidate who reflects the most beliefs of the most people gets elected, whether those beliefs are good for the nation or not.

If that is true, then the political direction of the nation doesn't change because of any candidate. Rather, the candidates change over time as a reflection of the consciousness of the people. Our very messy election cycles, and the resulting "leaders" that emerge from them, are really nothing more than a barometer of where the collective "all-of-us" stands on the various issues we think are important.

Thus, the way to genuinely effect a government policy change is to change the way "the people" collectively think and feel. That does **not** happen during a nasty political campaign ... it can only happen during those quieter times in between elections. Those of us who seek any kind of relief, change, equality, or advancement are really only going to achieve those things when we can quietly, lovingly, and convincingly prove to the majority of "the others" that what we want should also be what they want because it intrinsically reflects their own thoughts, feelings, and values. The bulk of our work for equality really needs to take place in between elections, and if we aren't willing to do that work, then we have no business expecting any particular election to provide us with results.

WHAT IS "FAMILY AFFAIRS" ?

FAMILY AFFAIRS is a free, twice-a-month, social activities newsletter for the GLBTI (gay/les/bi/trans/intersexed) community, sent out on the 1st and 15th of each month. It covers a 50 mile radius around Bangor and also Aroostook and Washington counties.

Do you want to host a potluck, attend a concert, or have someone to join you on that bus tour to Boston? Are you looking for someone to join you at the hockey or baseball games, for hiking, or to go to that special art exhibit? Are you looking for canoeing, golfing, camping, or fishing partners? This is the best place to look. Think up something fun to do, organize it, and let us know about it....it's easy!

CAN I ORGANIZE AN ACTIVITY THAT DOESN'T INCLUDE "EVERYONE" ?

Yes. People who want to organize an activity for the GLBT and/or I community are free to set whatever requirements or restrictions they want to on the activity they're organizing. If you want to organize a "women only" camping trip, a "men only" drumming night, a "youth from age 18-24 only" dance, or a day trip to a water park for GLBTI "couples with children", that would be fine.

CAN I POST A SOCIAL ITEM THAT'S NOT GLBTI FOCUSED?

But of course! Not everyone who watches women's basketball is a lesbian! If you want to organize an activity around something that is "mostly-straight-but-GLBTI-friendly", then do it!

CAVEATS:

All newsletters are emailed BCC, and the email list is not given out to anyone. Still, keep in mind that while this newsletter is for the GLBTI community, not everyone on the mailing list may be a "family" member. People ask to be put on the list and I put them on. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
