(NEWS #1:)

2009 WORLD AIDS DAY EVENTS (BANGOR) – In observance of World AIDS Day on December 1, 2009, **Eastern Maine AIDS Network (EMAN)** will be participating in day-long regional and state-wide events to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS, and ask members of the community to join them in a day of support, remembrance and reflection.

Please join the HIV/AIDS community for an event with lawmakers, community leaders, and those affected by HIV in a call to action at the Maine State House. Looming **state funding cuts are threatening our critical prevention, education, housing and care programs**. We must show lawmakers that HIV/AIDS continues to affect thousands in Maine and cutting these programs will have very serious effects on the health and well-being of all Maine citizens.

Families, communities, states and nations must step up if we are to get ahead of this disease. In Maine, more people than ever are living with HIV/AIDS and with new diagnoses on the rise and threats of even more funding cuts, we face even greater challenges in prevention, education, care and treatment.

Please join EMAN in recognizing those who have been affected, and unite to put a stop to the havoc it wreaks in our local and global community. The World AIDS Day events on December 1st include:

10:30am to Noon, Maine State House, Hall of Flags, Augusta

Panels from the AIDS Quilt and 1,300 individualized postcards of support from Mainers across the state will be on display; each postcard represents one person living with HIV/AIDS in the State of Maine.

10:00am to 4:00pm, University of Maine, Student Union, Orono

Panels from the AIDS Quilt will be on display to the public.

5:00pm University of Maine, Totman Room, Student Union, Orono

Discussion and debrief of Medication for Change project where participants have had the chance to experience 24 hours in the life of a person with HIV/AIDS, complete with individual identities and a placebo pill regimen. Will be followed by a candlelight vigil on the mall.

7:00pm Old Town Methodist Church, 744 Stillwater Avenue, Old Town

Panels from the AIDS Quilt will be on display to the public.

1. New GLBT Organizations at Husson University. Husson University has recently launched a Gay/Straight Student Alliance. So far, the organization has held a successful Open Mic night and informational campaign for No on 1 and also won second prize for their table at Husson's Open House. The group is making themselves known and eager to expand to include other members of the Husson/NESCOM community. The National Senior Citizens Law Center, Lambda Legal, the National Center for Lesbian Rights, the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force, the National Center for Transgender Equality, and Services & Advocacy for GLBT Elders (SAGE), are working together to raise awareness of the issues facing older adults who are lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender ("LGBT") and live in **nursing homes, assisted living facilities and other long-term care facilities.** We hope to identify areas where policy changes will improve care, and to find other older adults, advocates and providers interested in these issues.

Whether you are an older adult living in a long-term care facility or a family member, caretaker, social worker or friend, your answers to these questions will help as we work together to fight discrimination, abuse and neglect against LGBT older adults. Specifically, you should fill out this survey if you are:

- A lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender older adult who lives or has lived in a long-term care facility;
- A caregiver of an LGBT older adult who lives or has lived in a long-term care facility;
- A family member or friend with knowledge of an LGBT older adult's experience in a long-term care facility;
- A social worker or other helping professional who works with older adults.

Long-term care facilities include nursing homes, assisted living communities and senior living facilities.

The survey is only 16 questions. It should take no more than ten minutes to fill it out. The survey completely protects your confidentiality. *(However, we are looking for volunteers willing to be interviewed, so please consider checking that box!)*

5. Gay Male Research Participants Needed (PAID UMaine STUDY) Current research often does not reflect the diversity within society. The vast majority of research today is conducted using heterosexual participants which do not properly reflect all of society. Our lab is running a series of studies for which we hope to recruit gay male participants. We are hoping to recruit individuals to participate in a brief series of studies.

The first study is an online survey about social attitudes and Identity which takes about 15-20 minutes to complete.

The second study is on friendship formation and takes about 45mins-1hour.

The final study is a computer categorization task which takes about 10 mins.

Just like the line this jean vermette opened his pointless letter with, "For nearly a year, I have kept my mouth pretty-much shut " He might as well keep it shut for good ... that stupid letter is a waste of space & shows he has nothing to offer the lgbt community when it comes to civil rights ... feel free to communicate that to him. I'm sorry, but what the hell is the purpose of this silly letter? So, then no one should fight for any right because they could give that time and energy to some other cause?

A little time has passed since the vote, and I want to revisit the "no on 1" campaign. Hopefully, we all will revisit it again and again. Jean's op/ed intelligently addressed the huge sums of money that fueled both sides as well as issues like war and health care that are not only crucial to everyone but also give us all very common ground. Editorials have suggested that since marriage among LGBT folk probably would mean schools including some explanation to their students, maybe we might concede that. CNN has pointed out that the word "marriage" seems to be the major stumbling block, not legally defined attempts to further equality.

Although marriage is still extremely charged for those who voted to repeal (and some of us), the word is beoming less and less charged over time. During phone banking to a wide variety of voters, I was heartened to hear how many acknowledged that society changes and institutional definitions change.

Sure, I heard a little outright hostility and got some hang ups. But not often. Hearing people question and think aloud about the ins and outs was definitely encouraging.

We need to be more accepting of the uncertainty. Disagreements do not have to result in strong divisions. We need to build bridges with the other side. Although our hurt and anger are often very understandable, we also need to avoid terms like "hatred" and "bigotry." The language of victimization gets no one anywhere. And such extreme language not only tends to exaggerate the truth but also to polarize us from the very people we want to better understand and work with.

We did very well in a time when people are very frightened about the economy and health care. We did very well in a time of fear, when people are most likely to cling to the status quo and resist change. And we will continue, probably from different angles over the years.

Still, keep in mind that while this newsletter is for the GLBTI community, not everyone on the mailing list may be a "family" member. People ask to be put on the list and I put them on. There is no interview process or attempt to verify "queer" status. It's up to you to behave appropriately for whatever level of anonymity/security you feel you need.
