Dear Summer:

While Helen and I enjoyed Mueller's talk, there really was nothing to comment about, because he was giving a running narrative of what he had observed and I thought that the newspaper report would cover the matter more thoroughly than I could in a letter. True enough the Press Herald did a good job in reporting and I am enclosing the printed story.

Thanks for both your letters which I have sent right on to Mother and have asked her to return the one on Zionism. Then I will be in a position to comment.

As usual I am rushed. I am going to Boston tonight to attend the funeral of a Mr. Lyons, an elderly person who was Treasurer of the Saco-Moc Shoe Corporation in Portland and who was a client of mine. That means that I will get home Tuesday just in time to make the Draft Board meeting. And Wednesday after office hours we have the big monthly meeting of the Scouts which will be the kick-off dinner on the Growth Campaign. So be patient for a real letter from me.
