

ANNUAL REPORT 1966-1967

The twelfth year of the Macabee Club started on August 31, 1967, at President Steve Rubinoff's house. Mark Aranson was V-P, Chuck Stone was treasurer, Steve Burns was secretary, Alan Zimmerman was warden, and Ben Brem was chaplain. After a very hectic rush week, we swore in 19 new members (only 2 were lost to the opposition). We went international with the membership of Julian Kramer of South Africa who is Chucky's AFS brother. Gary Agger, perhaps the finest freshman athlete in the state, is also a new member.

For the first year we purchased club T-shirts. Although we had several paper drives scheduled, they were all cancelled for reasons beyond our control. We tentatively scheduled a visit to Boston to see the Patriots, but this idea was scrubbed. On November 12 we had a splash party and dance with Iota Phi. The club collected more than any organization in the city for the ALSAC drive. Although it was not a financial success, the kids had a great time at the Bermuda Bop.

Basin Street was a fantastic success. Boone's and Merle Hallett set the mood. We collected \$1091 in ads and boosters which is a new record. The formal cost us approximately \$700.

On February 12, we ventured to Boston to see the Celtics-76'ers game. It was a thrilling game that went down to the wire with the Celtics winning by one point.

It was a great year athletically. MZ was annihilated 51-19 in football. After a shaky beginning we settled down and played in the tradition of the old club. Sparked on offense by Burns and Agger, and on defense by Aranson, Kramer, Marcus, the Feders, Agger, and Zimmerman, it was impossible for them to stop us. The total score in the series is now 197-32.

Our basketball victory was even more stunning. We out-fought and outhustled Mz on February 5, and we were rewarded with a 64-60 win; it was only our second win ever over Mz. Gary Agger was sensational in scoring 32 points on 11 baskets. Zimmerman chipped in with 17 and Krems added six. P. Aranson and Cowboy Potter and M. Aranson helped under the boards.

Many members of the club were outstanding this year. George Marcus was President of the Sophomore class at D.H.S. Steve Rubinoff was V-P of student council. Gary Agger pitched a no-hitter and should star for Portland in three sports. Dave Hirshon set two records while running for King. Steve Burns scored in the SW championships and Alan Zimmerman is captain of the golf team at P.H.S. Singer, Aranson, and Murinson ran track; Marcus and Branz swam; Stone was on the tennis team; and Agger, Krems, and Silver played basketball.
