My dear Mamma:-

I am trying to keep cool now. I
got home from school about a half
an hour ago and have taking[sic]

her things so as to take them home
when she comes a week from next
Saturday so we are going to pack

it there. So you see we will have
only one trunk to fuss with the
last day.

we got here and had some

Her mother is very sick and so
she will not be here for a while.

We had a letter from her yesterday
